HOPE FOR HOUSING



For the past 15 years, Greendale People's Church has been

supportive of the **Hope for Housing Program**. This is a non-profit program developed by the Interfaith Coalition to Prevent Family Homelessness with assistance from the Central Massachusetts Housing Alliance (CMHA) to help people stay in their homes. The project raises awareness about homelessness and utilizes the collective buying power of more than 30 congregations to raise money for the prevention of family homelessness. The fastest-growing homeless population is children. It has been demonstrated that children who are homeless experience deflated selfworth, diminished school achievement, and related health and emotional issues.

Gift cards for local retailers, including *Amazon, Big Y, CVS, Dunkin' Donuts, Hannaford, Panera, Shaws, Starbucks, Stop & Shop, TJ Maxx, and Target* are purchased in bulk by the CMHA, that in turn are sold to members of our congregation. The retailers donate 2–10% of all sales to the Hope for Housing program to assist families at risk of homelessness. By purchasing gift cards for local retailers, you can help to stabilize families and keep them in their homes. These make a great gift and can help others in two ways: helping to prevent homelessness and brightening someone's day.

Summer Altar Flowers




There are a few Sundays open for the dedication of flowers for the summer. The Flower Chart for 2022 is posted on the bulletin board outside of Fisher Hall to sign

sense. Yancy helps us discover how to


